Opportunities:- 1. The institution is in rural area.

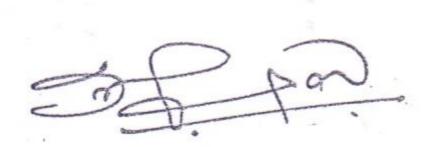
